Who created the intellectual property for this book? Whose ideas and thoughts went into writing it? Hint: You'll find the answer on the title page.

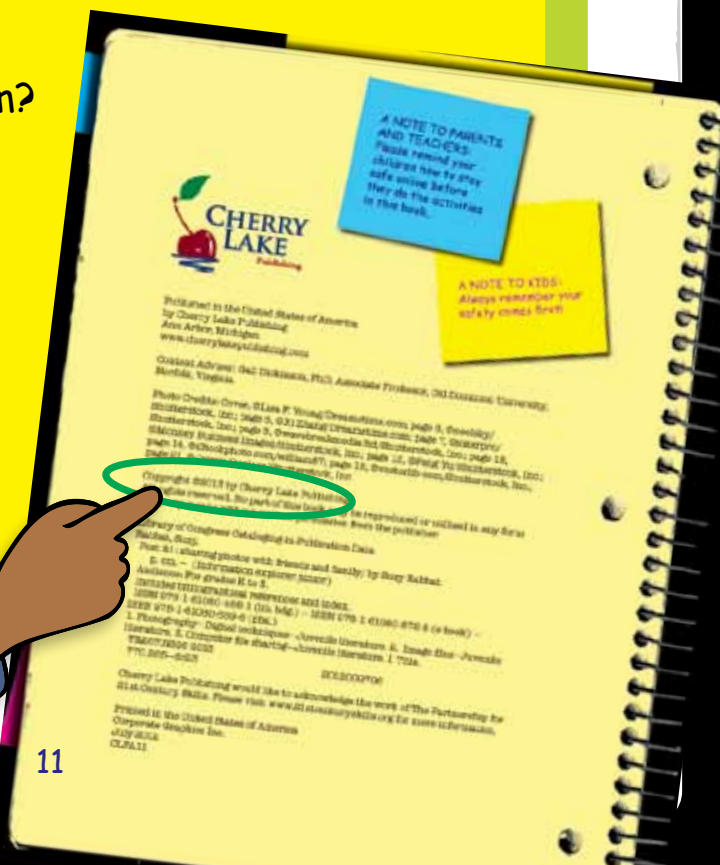
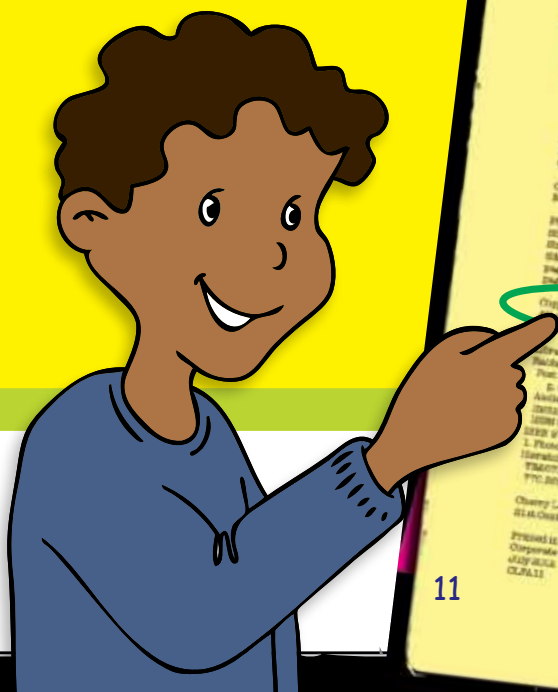




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# Activity

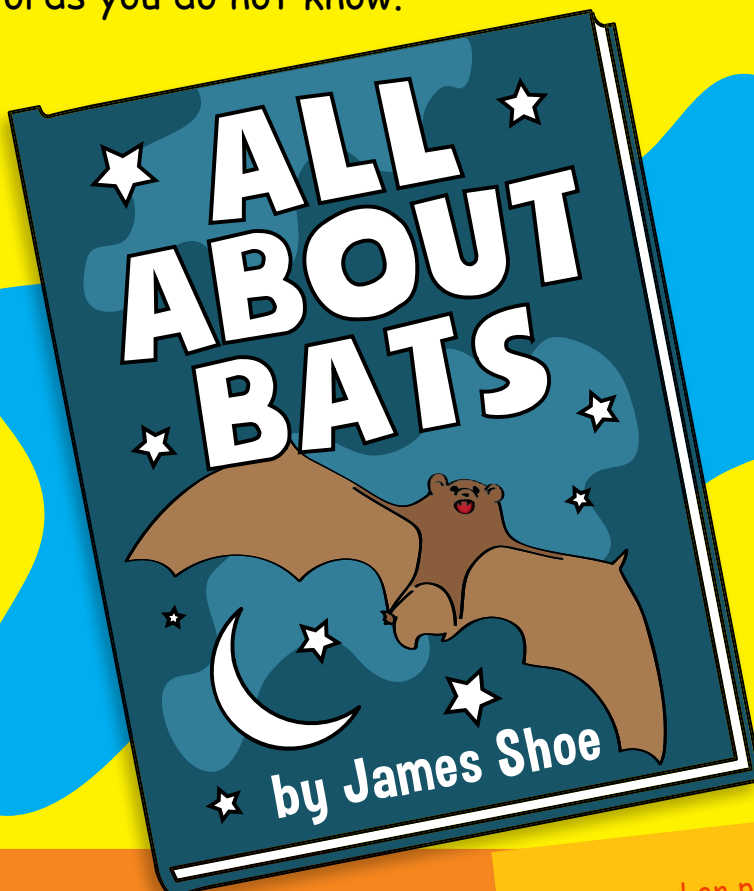
